# **Disaster Relief Program 2022**

Letters were sent to all our members in the St. Louis, MO area with information reminding them that we have funds available for them if they are needed.

Letters were also sent to our Florida members after Hurricane Ida to remind them of the same thing.

We had one generous donation of \$500.

Since the beginning of 2022 we gave grants to one COVID person, one St Louis person, and 4 Florida people. I have 2 pending applications. Just waiting for documentation. The beginning balance of the Disaster Relief fund as of January 1, 2022, was \$14,708. After the \$500 donation and the grant payouts of \$3250, the current balance as of November 3, 2022, is \$11,958.
