- The more reliable (documented) information about your ancestors you can find, the better.
- Especially important is correct spelling of names names of parents, grandparents, and place or area of origin.
- Any immigration and naturalization documents may be a great help to get started.
- Talk to your family to learn what they know about ancestors.
- Check if you have any old papers, letters, photographs, documents, etc., that belonged to your relatives. You
 may find in these documents, probably written in Polish, important notes and comments that may assist in your
 research.
